In 1823, Elias Boudinot, a brilliant young Cherokee wrote the first Native American fiction called, "Poor Sarah." It told about a "poor Indian widow" who had been mentally and physically abused by her husband all of her life and how she eventually found God and salvation. It became a national best seller and it was first published in English and translated into Cherokee. Boudinot is considered to be the "Father of Native American Literature."
